



Decoration Policy

Incarnation's Cemetery Decoration Policy is designed to keep the cemetery grounds neat, clean, safe and create an atmosphere of simplicity for visitors and workers. We encourage you to honor the memory of your loved one with permitted items.

Spring and Summer Decorations

1. Annuals and plants are permitted in front of raised monuments not to extend beyond twelve inches of the monument. Perennial plants such as sedum and lilies along with evergreen trees and bushes are not permitted. If containers are used, please be sure to use non-breakable containers.
2. Fresh cut flowers placed at gravesites need to be in non-breakable containers.
3. Plastic flowers are not permitted. Miscellaneous items such as all plastic and paper decorations, glass jars, bottles, or similar articles are unsuitable in appearance, easily damaged and are unsafe and not in keeping with the dignity of the cemetery. They will be removed by the cemetery workers.
4. Flags are permitted on Memorial Day, Independence Day and Veterans Day. Flags should be removed in a timely manner by family members.
5. Trees and bushes next to monuments and markers are not permitted, but memorials in designated areas of the cemetery may be donated in memory of loved ones. Contact the Incarnation Church office for details.

Winter Decorations

1. Evergreen wreaths, sprays and baskets may be placed on stands by grave sites. All winter decorations will be removed during the month of April by cemetery workers. Each year our cemetery staff provides wreath stands for your use. They are placed in front of the main white building (resembling a church) in December.

Columbarium Policy

1. Please do not use tape, glue or any other substance to attach items to walls or niches.
2. Fresh cut flowers in non-breakable containers may be placed at the bottom of the columbarium wall.

By following these guidelines, we can preserve and enhance the beauty of the entire cemetery and provide a dignified and comforting place to visit.
