Learning from Both the Tender and the Harsh Words of Jesus in the Gospel of Matthew

Presenter: Matt Skinner, Asher O. and Carrie Nasby Professor of New Testament, Luther Seminary

All four Gospels present Jesus as a teacher with both reassuring and unsettling things to say. The contrast is most striking in Matthew's Gospel, where you can read a passage full of grace and comfort, then turn the page and be taken aback by threats of judgment. How do Jesus's promises of mercy relate to his warnings? This overview of some of the main themes in Matthew will offer a clearer view of how the Gospels remember Jesus's teachings, what those teachings mean, and how we might sort through them ourselves to make better sense of Jesus's message to us.

Skinner, also Scholar for Adult Education at Westminster Presbyterian Church, is a longtime cohost of Sermon Brainwave, a weekly podcast that helps preachers work with biblical passages as they prepare their sermons. One of his recently published books is *Matthew: The Gospel of Promised Blessings*, which explores the Gospel of Matthew and its most important themes.

LifeHaven Program for year-round use for birthdays, rewards for achieving set goals, use before benefits become available, & other emergency situations. We also had \$1,000.00 given to the LifeHaven program in cash donations that were very timely in repairing & replacing two LifeHaven house refrigerators!

The LifeHaven House is currently housing & supporting five youth & their children. LifeHaven staff also continue to support & be a resource to seven young adults & their children that have transitioned out of LifeHaven and into independent living.

The Gospel of Matthew portrays Jesus and his message as full of tender compassion and urgent warning. This six-part exploration of an enigmatic Gospel takes readers into the themes, topics, and tensions at the heart of Matthew's story about the life and work of Jesus. Chapters focus on blessing and comfort, judgment and retribution, the meaning of discipleship, Jesus' vision for the Church and world, conflicts and complaints, and how the Gospel of Matthew speaks to believers today.

Tell Me Something Good: Grounding ourselves in the good news this Lent

Lent was originally a season for those new to faith to learn and prepare for their baptism at Easter. During that time, they would study what was central to Christianity. What are the core, foundational parts of Jesus' life and ministry? What makes it good news? Can we trust that the good news is truly good, even when it challenges us?

The good news brings us back to our roots, back to what grounds us: loving our neighbor, caring for the vulnerable, pursuing justice and mercy, and resting in God's unending grace. The good news grows like a mustard seed that flourishes rapidly into a tree to shelter the birds. It sounds like children laughing. It feels like feet washed with tender care. The good news is alive in the world. When we are grounded in the good news, the goodness of God can infinitely flourish and grow.

We hope this series will provide fertile ground for conversation and worship, rooting our hearts and lives in the expansive goodness of God. This Lent, may the teachings of Jesus lead us forward. Let the good news ground us. And let that good

news inspire us to take action in a world desperate to hear, see and taste what is good.
