

Worship Banner

Red, the liturgical color of Reformation Sunday, represents the power, fire, and activity of the Holy Spirit. The Reformation movement centered on God's grace through the Spirit. Martin Luther said, "The Holy Spirit has called me by the Gospel, enlightened me with His gifts..." Seven flames represent the gifts of the Holy Spirit: wisdom, understanding, counsel, fortitude, knowledge, piety, and fear of the Lord (Isaiah 11:2-3).



The white dove is a symbol of the Holy Spirit. White is also the liturgical color for All Saints Sunday, an occasion to remember those who have died in the Christian faith.



All Saints Sunday, November 2, is set aside to remember the people throughout the generations whose lives of faith and love have shaped ours. We honor their memory by lighting a candle. We celebrate who we are in community by being willing to both grieve and rejoice in their presence together.



From Movement to Church: How the Lutherans Became a Church

Presenter: Mark Granquist, Lloyd and Annelotte Svendsbye Professor, the History of Christianity, Luther Seminary

During the 1520s, those who were drawn to Martin Luther's new gospel movement faced a daunting realization: increasingly they came to understand that for the sake of the gospel, they had to form a new kind of church. For our contemporary Lutheran heritage, we need to understand the decisions they made, and how they continue to shape and affect us.

Author of many books, book chapters many book chapters, articles and essays, especially on the history of Lutherans in North America, Granquist's most recent publication is *A History of Christianity in America* (Baker Academic. 2025).

Snack Drive for Mounds View Schools

In August, Ralph Reeder alerted Toni Schutta and the *Help a Neighbor* non-profit that 500 food-insecure school children, ages K-8th grade, would go without a daily snack at snack time this school year and asked for assistance. *Help a Neighbor* agreed to take on this project, which means that 83,000 individually packaged snacks (500 children x 166 days of school) are being sought, and/or \$26,000 to cover the cost of the "Smart Snacks for Smart Kids" program. This will take a village!

Imagine that you're 5-years-old and it's snack time at school. Kids on all sides of you have a snack for all 166 days of school but you don't because your family can't afforc send a snack. Students often feel left out, sad and most importantly hungry! That was the case for 500 students at Mounds View Schools last year. We're going to try and remarks that and we need were the

sep a renginor (Narky, a local non-profit, is hoping to provide 900 suddins a daily shool snack. That's 83,000 individually-packed snacks needed for a budget of 26,580.

Why It's important: Hunger significanily affects a child's ability to concentrate, retain information, and engage in learning activities. Snacking helps stabilize blood sugar levels and provides the energy needed to stay focused and engaged in school.

Two Ways You Can Help Support This Important Cause:

-) Donate money to "Help a Neighbor" and HAN will purchase the snack bags for the 500 students in need.
- A \$53 donation provides a daily snack for one student for the school year (500 students are in need.)
- A \$250 donation provides students in one school one snack for one mor (10 schools are in the program.)
- A \$1,000 donation provides students in four schools one snack for months. (10 schools are in the program.)
- In-kind donations from individuals, groups and businesses who purchas snacks.

Individually-packaged snacks such as soft granola bars, Sun Chips, Chex Mix, Mini Pretzels (1.5-2.0 oz.) are needed. Boxes of these snack bags are welcomed!







Celebrating the Success of the Solid Ground Gala!




