Worship Banner

The banner brings the message of the candles in an Advent wreath. The first candle represents the Hope we have in Christ, the second is a reminder that Christ came to bring Peace, the third candle represents the Joy of Christ's coming, and the fourth candle represents God's Love through Christ. The banner features a fifth candle, a large white Christ candle that represents the light that was brought into the world when he was born. The Christ candle is a symbol of transition from prophecy to fulfillment. The candles are placed on a background of blue, the liturgical color of the Season of Advent.





Welcome to Advent!

Luke's Gospel begins the story of Jesus with this opening line: "In the time of Herod..." This detail may seem minor to modern readers; however, it reveals layers of information about the fearful world Jesus entered, one filled with rampant oppression, economic disparity, uncertainty, and instability. A world not so unlike our own. And yet, throughout the stories of Christ's birth, the whispers of angels deliver a surprising message: "Do not fear." In our own time, we might ask: Is it even possible to be fearless in a fearful world? When Mary, Joseph, the shepherds, and the magi are each called into God's redemptive story, they do not deny their fears—they move through them. They ask questions, hold fast to courage, trust in good news, and say, "Here I am, Lord." When we find ourselves in fearful times, can we acknowledge our fears while also insisting on hope?

Every Advent, we light candles, sing carols, and pray for Christ's coming because we believe God entered a frightened world to bring good news. We hold onto hope because we believe that Christ did come—that's the promise of the season. Our hope is not flimsy or fleeting. It's gritty, resilient, and can endure—no matter what we fear or face. This season, let us insist on hope and trust that good news is greater than fear.

What can you expect this Advent?

In addition to meaningful Sunday worship around this theme of hope, watch for these extras:

On Advent Wednesdays – December 3, December 10, and December 17 at 6 pm In the middle of this beautiful evening prayer by Marty Haugen, we will offer a scripture, a time of silence (where you may simply be present and/or pray a simple breath prayer that we'll offer), and a poem.

Safety & Security Update

Incarnation has taken steps to protect anyone in the building: members, children, staff and visitors:

After some startup issues, the inside doors at Door 1 are now locked Monday – Thursday, 8 am to 3 pm.

- All outside doors are locked during office hours.
- Door 1 vestibule doors will be open with the staff granting entry via video intercom.
- Small Group Leaders meeting during office hours will need to greet members at Door 1 to allow entry.
- Doors will auto-unlock for Sunday mornings, Wednesday nights and other events as needed.
- Preschool entry processes at door 2 will continue unchanged.

Youth & Family Ministry The Weekly Update

On Wednesday, 12/3, we ate Mansetti's pizza, then participated in meaningful Advent worship together in the sanctuary. After that, we headed into our small groups to discuss the perfectly imperfect example of disciple, Simon Peter (6/7th grade), and how our sacraments—baptism and communion—are important rituals of connection to Christ and to each other (8th grade). It was a night of talking about welcome, belonging, and unity across our differences. We'll follow the same schedule (i.e., worship, then small groups) on December 10 and 17. On Wednesday, December 17, (weather permitting) after pizza at 5:00 pm and worship at 6:00 pm, we'll head out into the surrounding neighborhood for a time of carolling...
